RobecoSAM Smart Energy Equities is an actively managed fund that invests globally in companies providing technologies for clean energy production, distribution, power management infrastructure and energy efficiency. The selection of these stocks is based on fundamental analysis. The fund's objective is to achieve a better return than the index. The fund has sustainable investment as its objective, within the meaning of Article 9 of the Regulation (EU) 2019/2088 of 27 November 2019 on Sustainability-related disclosures in the financial sector. The fund's objective is also to achieve a better return than the index. The strategy integrates sustainability criteria as part of the stock selection process and through a theme-specific sustainability assessment. The portfolio is built on the basis of an eligible investment universe that includes companies whose business models contribute to the thematic investment objectives. 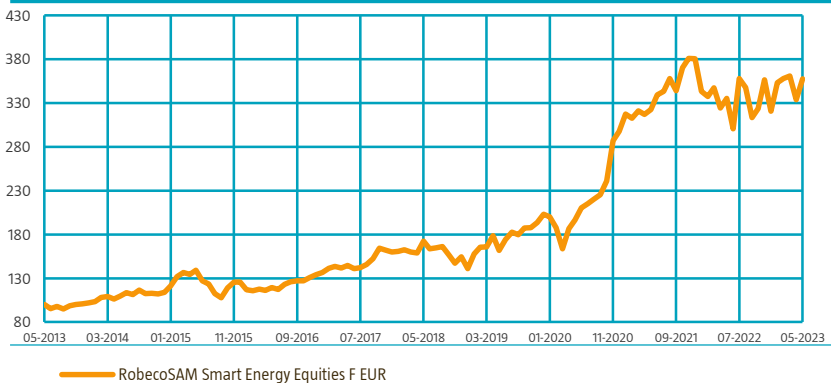

### Performance

Based on transaction prices, the fund's return was 7.10%.

Energy Management was the strongest cluster in May. Semiconductor power management companies were the strongest driver, recovering from a rather weak April. Underlying demand, particularly in auto, industrials and renewables continues to hold up well, with Onsemi giving a strong mid-term outlook at its investor day. The Energy Efficiency cluster was slightly ahead of the overall fund, with Energy Efficiency Big Data being by far the strongest sub-cluster. The very strong outlook for the bellwether in AI chips, NVIDIA, gave a boost to all holdings exposed to data centers such as Marvell Technology, which was the best monthly performer. Energy Distribution showed a mixed performance. The Equipment Supplier sub-cluster continued to perform well, while the defensive Electric Network sector underperformed. Renewable Energy was the weakest cluster with sentiment towards renewables being more mixed, as the market is digesting initial IRS guidance on the local content rules from the Inflation Reduction Act. A positive outlier was First Solar, as a clear winner of the local content rule.

### Market development

The global equity markets continued their upward slope, at least in euro terms. May was all about the debt ceiling debate and probably even more about the artificial intelligence hype, which propelled big tech to new highs. The dispersion in the equity market was very large and its breadth continued to decline. The good performance was primarily driven by the technology sector, while the energy and materials sectors were the largest laggards. Regionally, China reopening lagged behind the high expectations and disappointed investor sentiment, which led to a sell-off in Chinese equities. The Fed and the ECB continued on their path and raised interest rates further, but the Fed hinted at a pause. Macro data remained mixed, with the global manufacturing PMI hovering close to the 50 levels, while the global service PMI held up nicely in the mid-50s, signaling further economic expansion.

### Expectation of fund manager

Inflation in North America and Europe has likely peaked, but fears remain that inflation will stay higher for a bit longer. The recent banking crisis will likely lead to some further tightening of financial conditions, even without the Fed becoming more restrictive. Long-term interest rates started to reflect this new outlook and are trading below recent peaks. This should give valuation support for quality growth companies with sound balance sheets. With China recovering from the Covid downturn, we expect gradually improving global supply chains through 2023 and easing input cost inflation. Therefore, we are confident on the earnings outlook for our portfolio going into 2023, even with a more challenging macro backdrop, as high energy prices and the urgent need for energy independence act as a catalyst for more investments in energy technologies. The fund management team remains constructive on the mid to long-term prospects of our holdings.

### Top 10 largest positions

Infineon is a market leading power semiconductor company with significant exposure to the car industry, especially electric vehicles, but also to renewables, industrials, communications and data centers, and is part of the Energy Management cluster. First Solar is a leading US solar module producer in the Renewables cluster. SSE is a UK-based power-generation utility that has the leading renewable electricity portfolio in the UK and Ireland, and is part of the Electric Networks sub-cluster. Schneider Electric is a large European provider of equipment and services related to building automation and controls, and is part of the Energy Efficiency cluster. European-based Vestas is the largest wind turbine producer and part of the Renewables cluster.

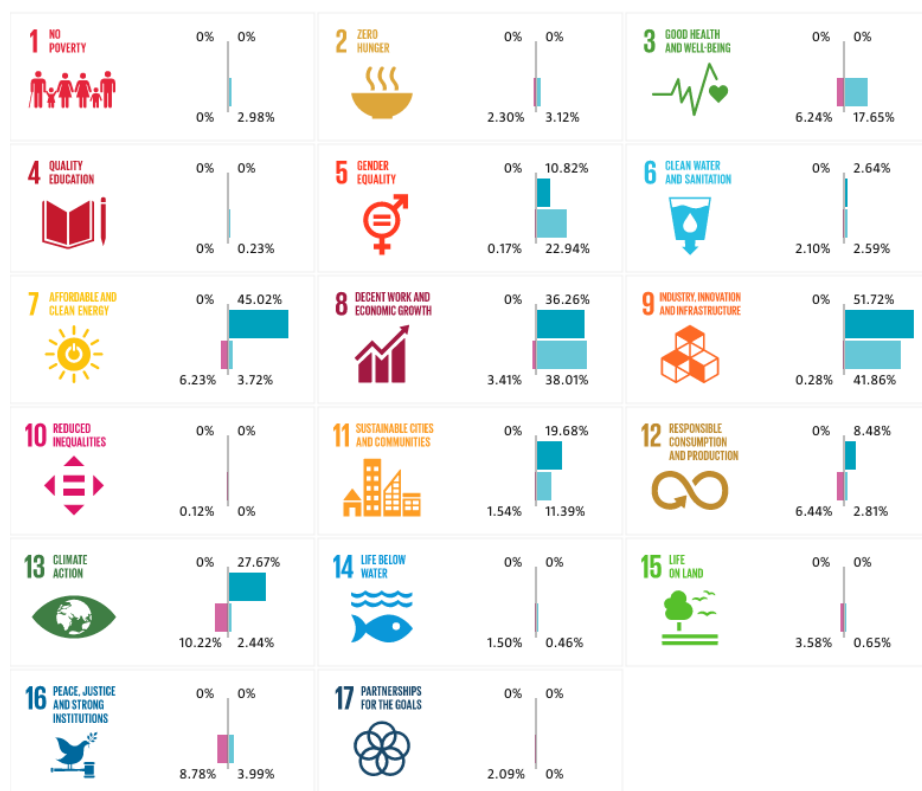
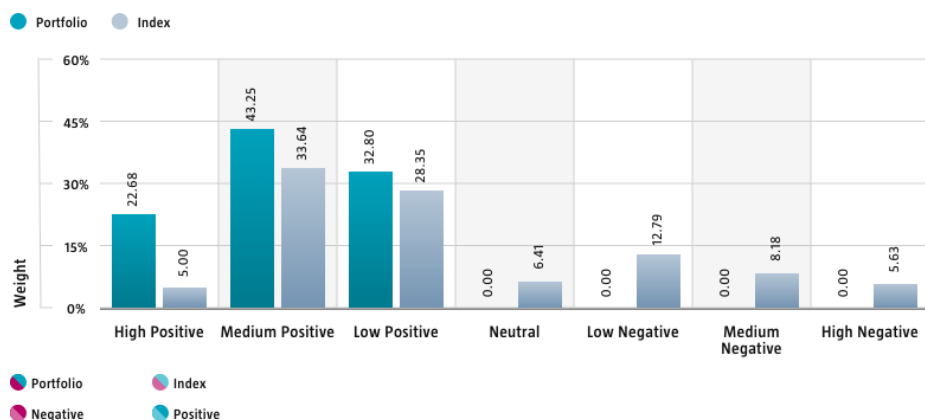
## Sustainability

The fund's sustainable investment objective is to further the transformation and decarbonization of the global energy sector. The transformation and decarbonization of the energy sector and sustainability considerations are incorporated in the investment process by the means of a target universe definition, exclusions, ESG integration, a carbon footprint target and voting. The fund only invests in companies that have a significant thematic fit as per Robeco's thematic universe methodology. Through screening on both Robeco's internally developed SDG Framework and Robeco's exclusion policy, the fund does not invest in issuers that have a negative impact on the SDGs, are in breach of international norms or where products have been deemed controversial. Financially material ESG factors are integrated in the bottom-up fundamental investment analysis to assess existing and potential ESG risks and opportunities. The fund's weighted carbon footprint will be equal to or better than that of its Climate Transition Benchmark. In addition, where a stock issuer is flagged for breaching international standards in the ongoing monitoring, the issuer will become subject to exclusion. Lastly, the fund makes use of shareholder rights and applies proxy voting in accordance with Robeco's proxy voting policy.

## SDG Impact Alignment

This distribution across SDG scores shows the portfolio weight allocated to companies with a positive, negative and neutral impact alignment with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) based on Robeco's SDG Framework. The framework, which utilizes a three-step approach to assess a company's impact alignment with the relevant SDGs, provides a methodology for assigning companies with an SDG score. The score ranges from positive to negative impact alignment with levels from high, medium or low impact alignment. This results in a 7-step scale from -3 to +3. If the data set does not cover the full portfolio, the figures shown above each impact level sum to the coverage level to reflect the data coverage of the portfolio, with minimal deviations that reflect rounding. Weights < 0.5% will show as 0. If an index has been selected, the same figures are also provided for the index. Holdings mapped as corporates and/or sovereign are included in the figures.

The selection of these stocks is based on fundamental analysis. The fund has sustainable investment as its objective within the meaning of Article 9 of the European Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation. The fund furthers the decarbonization of the global energy sector through investments in clean energy sources, energy efficient products and infrastructure and by the electrification of the industrial, transportation and heating sectors. This is done by investing in companies that advance the following UN Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs): Affordable and Clean Energy goal, Decent work and economic growth, Industry, innovation and infrastructure, Sustainable cities and communities, and Climate action. The fund integrates ESG (Environmental, Social and Governance) factors in the investment process and applies Robeco's Good Governance policy. The fund applies sustainability indicators, including but not limited to normative, activity-based and region-based exclusions, and proxy voting. The fund also aims to achieve a better return than the index. The strategy integrates sustainability criteria as part of the stock selection process and through a theme-specific sustainability assessment. The portfolio is built on the basis of an eligible investment universe that includes companies whose business models contribute to the thematic investment objectives. The assessment regarding relevant SDGs uses an internally developed framework, more information on which can be obtained at [www.robeco.com/si](http://www.robeco.com/si). Benchmark: MSCI World Index TRN. The majority of stocks selected will be components of the benchmark, but stocks outside the benchmark may be selected too.
