FUND DESCRIPTION

The Fund aims to achieve capital growth through investing primarily in the quoted securities of companies operating in Japan and provide a high total return for a suitable long term appreciation of the investor's capital. The Investment Manager selects stocks for investment from approximately the top 300 stocks by market capitalisation in the Tokyo market. It's approach is to invest in large-capitalised Japanese companies within the Tokyo Stock Price Index focusing on stocks with a low Price to Book Ratio and a high dividend yield. The Fund will be investing primarily in listed or traded shares of issuers in Japan, or which derive a substantial part of their revenue from Japan. It may also invest in other asset classes, including debt securities, currencies, deposits and other Funds and in other regions. The Fund may use financial derivative instruments where it is more economically effective than holding the underlying asset or for other efficient portfolio management purposes. The Fund is actively managed. The Fund does not intend to track either the Tokyo Stock Price Index or the Russell/Nomura Large Cap Value Index and is not constrained by them. Both the benchmarks are used for performance comparison purposes. The RNLCV benchmark is used for risk management purposes to ensure that the Fund is managed in a manner consistent with its investment objective and risk profile.

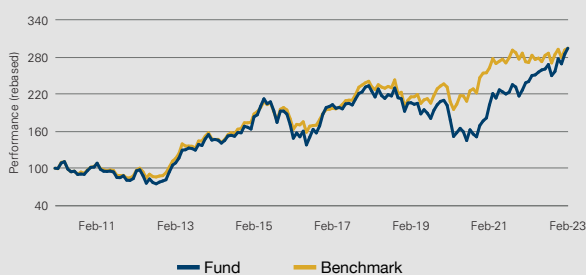

PERFORMANCE CHART (SINCE INCEPTION)



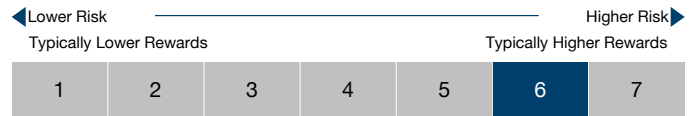

The Fund may be regarded as promoting, among other characteristics, environmental and social characteristics within the meaning of Article 8 of SFDR. The Investment Manager applies an exclusion list which prevents it from investing in controversial stocks or industries which may be related to arms and munitions, nuclear weapons, tobacco and companies which have moderate to significant amount of revenues associated with coal production.



COMMENTARY

The Fund rose 3.24% (I JPY share class; 3.24% for the D JPY share class) in February compared to an increase of 0.95% in TOPIX, and a rise of 2.5% in the Russell/Nomura Large Cap Value Index (all figures in yen, total return).

February saw the nomination of Kazuo Ueda to be the next Governor of the Bank of Japan. Following the surprise change to yield curve control policy in December, the selection of Mr Ueda came as another shock to markets as he was not on any commentators' shortlists of potential candidates. Indeed Masayoshi Amamiya was widely expected to ascend from the board to the top position, and given he had been a key architect of the last decade's ultra-loose monetary policy he would have been very likely to prefer a dovish stance. However, it emerged that Mr Amamiya ruled himself out of the running saying he would not be the right person for the next phase of monetary policy, effectively hinting that a regime change was coming sooner or later. Ueda, previously on the BoJ board between 1998 and 2005 and most recently a university professor, is seen to have a much more balanced outlook and is more suited to policy normalisation.

As widely expected, Mr Ueda's three hour speech to parliament held back on any shock and awe, and stuck to the BoJ script promoted by the outgoing Governor Kuroda, saying that stimulus should be maintained for now. He did, however, flag the need to consider returning to a normal policy approach if the outlook for prices clearly improved. With the national CPI figures for January showing the fastest rate of inflation in 40 years at 4.3%, increasing from 4.0% previously, the stars do seem to be aligning.

Alongside price inflation, the BoJ has been watching negotiations for wage hikes which are seen as key to promoting stable demand-pull inflation. Announcements from various companies have trickled out over the last few months, with salaries and bonuses in many cases being raised substantially and for the first time in many years. Among the announcements in February were the mega banks with their first increase since 2011. Perhaps in a sign of confidence that their underlying businesses are about to see a more accommodative rate environment, they increased starting salaries by around 25%. Honda* and Toyota also announced more wide sweeping wage rises at the highest rate of increase in 30 and 20 years respectively.

An important story that is beginning to gain traction, and should be especially positive for value investing, is the Tokyo Stock Exchange's efforts as part of the corporate governance movement focusing on low price-to-book (PBR) stocks. Last year the TSE implemented considerable reforms imposing stricter requirements for listing based on liquidity and financial reporting standards. Continuing their efforts this year the TSE has published a working paper discussing the need to enhance financial management of companies, especially for those with PBRs below 1x, which currently accounts for around half of the companies listed on TOPIX. Following on from the Stewardship Code of 2014 and Corporate Governance Code of 2015, the TSE has used some strong language about their aims to educate or re-educate corporate management on things like cost of capital: *"Encourage listed companies to raise awareness and literacy regarding cost of capital and stock price/market capitalization and promote efforts to improve them. Require that management and the board of directors properly identify the company's cost of capital and capital efficiency, evaluate those statuses and its stock price and market capitalization, and disclose policies and specific initiatives for improvement and the progress thereof as necessary. Especially for companies that clearly need to improve, such as those with a PBR consistently below 1x."*

We believe that the above measures will naturally have a more positive impact on value companies, rather than for growth companies that already have higher PBRs.

Quarterly results season concluded in February and it was evident that supply chains are recovering more slowly than expected, with continued pinch points in semiconductors, logistics and some materials. An encouraging feature was that although some companies cut forecasts and initially stock prices reacted negatively, there were notable recoveries in the following days as fears seemed to ease. Amidst the reporting season, we finally saw the resolution of the discussions Nissan* was having with alliance partner Renault. In a positive move for Nissan, Renault will reduce their stake from 43% to 15% by shifting their shares into a trust negating the need to immediately sell the stock into the market. Nissan will gain the ability to vote on their shares in Renault, making the relationship equal and opening the way for the two companies to invest in their joint venture for electric vehicles.

*A word on terminology

Companies listed on the Tokyo stock market are divided into two groups by size: Large and Small; with Large further subdivided into Top (largest) and Mid (medium). Japanese listed companies are also divided into two groups by valuation - showing how high a price investors are prepared to pay for their shares. The measure used is the Price to Book ratio (PBR), which compares the company's share price with the accounting value of its assets. Companies whose PBR is low are known as Value (cheap), while those with high PBRs are known as Growth (expensive). Japan CoreAlpha targets stocks in the Large and Value segments. The share price performance of companies in these two groups is therefore key to the Fund's performance.

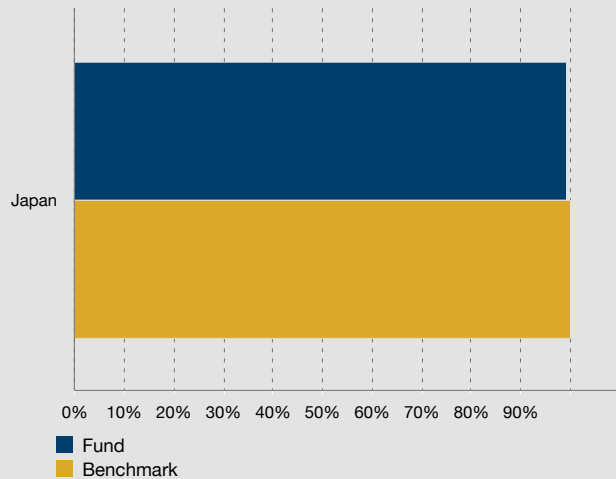

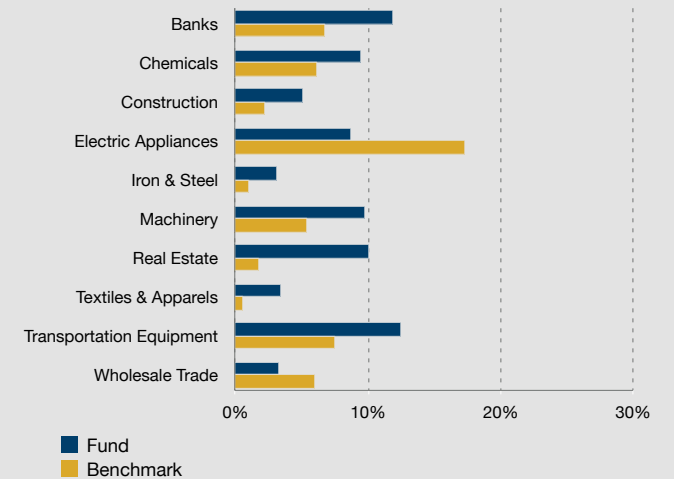

GLOSSARY

Active Share	Active share is a measure of the percentage of stock holdings in a manager's portfolio that differ from the reference index.
Annualised Return	An annualised total return is an average amount of money earned by an investment each year over a given time period. It is calculated to show what an investor would earn over a period of time if the annual return was compounded.
Annualised Volatility	Volatility is the rate and extent at which the price of a portfolio, security or index, moves up and down. If the price swings up and down with large movements, it has high volatility. If the price moves more slowly and to a lesser extent, it has lower volatility. It is used as a measure of the riskiness of an investment. Annualised volatility is an average annual amount of volatility over a given time period.
Beta	A measure of how sensitive an investment portfolio is to market movements. The sign of the beta (+/-) indicates whether, on average, the portfolio's returns move in line with (+), or in the opposite direction (-), to the market. The market has a beta of 1. If the portfolio has a beta of less (more) than 1, it means that the security is theoretically less (more) volatile than the market.
Comparator Benchmark	An index or similar factor against which a fund manager invites investors to compare a fund's performance.
Constraining Benchmark	An index or similar factor that fund managers use to limit or constrain how they construct a fund's portfolio. By default this is also a comparator benchmark.
Correlation	A measure of the interdependence or strength of the relationship between two investments. A correlation of 1 means that the two investments are perfectly synchronised, -1 implies that they move in symmetrically opposite directions and 0 means no relationship between them.
Entry Charge	The entry charge shown is a maximum figure and in some cases you might pay less. Please refer to your financial advisor or the distributor for the actual charges.
Exposure	This refers to the part of a portfolio that is subject to the price movements of a specific security, sector, market or economic variable. It is typically expressed as a percentage of the total portfolio, e.g. the portfolio has 10% exposure to the mining sector.

Market Cap	The market value of a company's outstanding shares. NAV	The Net Asset Value (NAV) represents the value per share. It is calculated by dividing the total net asset value of the fund (the value of the fund's assets less its liabilities) by the number of shares outstanding.
Ongoing Charge Figure (OCF)	The OCF is estimated and based on expenses and may vary from year to year. It includes management fees but excludes performance fees (where applicable) and portfolio transaction costs, except in the case of an entry/exit charge paid by the Fund when buying or selling units in another sub-fund. Overweight/Underweight	Refers to a fund's position in line with its chosen reference index. Overweight means a fund holds more of a certain security than the reference index and underweight means a fund holds less of a certain security compared to its reference index.

Position Concentration	The proportion of a portfolio's net asset value represented by the largest (e.g. 5/10/20) positions.

Sector	A sector is an area of the economy in which businesses share the same or a related product or service. It can also be thought of as an industry or market that shares common operating characteristics. Dividing an economy into different pieces allows for more in-depth analysis of the economy as a whole.
Sharpe Ratio	The Sharpe Ratio is a measure for calculating risk-adjusted return, and has become the industry standard for such calculations. The Sharpe Ratio is the average return earned in excess of the risk-free rate per unit of volatility or total risk. The higher the ratio the better, with a number greater than 1 usually considered good, a number greater than 2 considered very good and a ratio of 3 or higher considered excellent.
